“ The American Legion ”

Have you ever wondered, as legionnaires, “Who and What is the American Legion?”

The American Legion was chartered by the U. S. Congress in 1919 as a patriotic, mutual-help, war-time veteran’s organization. The American Legion is a community-service organization which now numbers nearly 3 million members, men and women, in nearly 15,000 American Legion Posts worldwide. The American Legion, Department of Maryland was founded and chartered in the year 1919. The membership in the State of Maryland now numbers nearly 81 thousand members, both men and women, in 157 American Legion Posts statewide. These Posts range in size from 15 members to over 4700 members in a given post.

Membership eligibility in the American Legion is based on honorable federal active duty service with the U.S. Armed Forces between the following dates:

April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918 (World War I)
December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946 (World War II)
June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955 (Korean War)
February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975 (Vietnam War)
August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984 (Lebanon/Grenada)
December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990 (Operation Just Cause-Panama)

*August 2, 1990 to Today (Operation Desert Shield/Storm)

*Because eligibility dates remain open, all members of the U.S. Armed Forces are eligible to join the American Legion at this time, until the date of the end of hostilities as determined by the government of the United States.

“2007”, another year, has quickly passed us by. As your 1st Vice-Commander, my main responsibility is to maintain and promote our Legion Post’s membership. Our Post fell short in its goal of retaining our 3 and 4 Star membership status during the 2007 membership year. Therefore, I have focused on the goal of regaining the status of a 3 Star Post or hopefully better yet, attaining a 4 Star Post level.

As an individual, I can only do so much. However, with the help of each and every member to recruit new membership, our goals can easily be accomplished. We currently have 539 members who have either renewed their membership for 2008, have joined as new members or have transferred-in to our Post. We are currently at 88 percent of reaching our goal of 613 paid members for the 2008 year, as established by the Department of Maryland. We need 74 more memberships to reach this goal. 69 more memberships will give the Post recognition for attaining a 3 Star Membership Status. 99 more and we attain 4 Star Membership Status.

We Want Your Old Eyeglasses

Chances are that you have at least one pair of old unused eyeglasses on the shelf because you didn't want to just toss them. The **Severn River Lions Club** has an easy solution for you. The club collects old but useable eyeglasses and hearing aids for recycling. Twice each year all the Lions clubs in the district (Anne Arundel, Howard, Baltimore City and county, and Harford county) sort the glasses that have been collected. At the last sorting Lions boxed nearly 75,000 pairs of used eyeglasses. These are boxed and sent to an eyeglass reclamation facility in Virginia where they are sanitized, graded for prescription, marked and packaged for use in third world countries. The eyeglasses are given to needy vision impaired residents in these countries and help them see and be able to function with better vision.

The Lions also collect used hearing aids, which are refurbished and offered to needy people through the Towson University Speech and Hearing Center.

Where do I drop off my used eyeglasses or hearing aids? There is a colorful eyeglass collection box near the stage in the bar area of the Legion hall. On your next visit bring your used eyeglasses and drop them in the collection box.

The Lions thank you and a recipient somewhere in the world who receives your used eyeglasses to improve sight thanks you.

for 2007- 2008*

The Severn River Lions Club again is set to offer select Florida citrus each month from November through March.

The Lions offer premium fruit from H & S Citrus, shipped directly from the orchards to Severna Park.

Ruby Red grapefruit is offered every month. In November and December, navel oranges are in season. In January, navel oranges are typically in season. Otherwise, we offer tart, tangy and sweet temple oranges.

Grapefruit is \$16 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$28 for a 4/5 bushel box.

Navel oranges are \$15 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$26 for a 4/5 bushel box.

Honeybells (in January) are \$21 for a 2/5 bushel box.

All proceeds go to school scholarships and local charities.
