From Your Service Officer

Did You Know:

Charlotte Hall Veterans Home is a State of Maryland long term healthcare facility, located on 126 acres St. Mary's County. The Home opened in 1985, and has 504 beds. The Home offers two basic programs of care: Assisted Living (226 beds), and Comprehensive Nursing Home Care (278 beds), including a 42-bed Alzheimer's unit. Clinical care and healthcare management at the Home are provided by a private contractor. The Executive Director and a State staff supervise the Contractor and over all operation of the Home.

The Home is a program of the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs. The Maryland Veterans Home Commission formerly was the sole governing body, but since the creation of the Department in 1999, functions as an advisory body to the Secretary. The Commission is comprised of 11 members appointed by the Governor, as well as the following ex officio members: Governor, President of the State Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Delegates. Traditionally, the ex officio members have appointed individuals to represent them on the Commission.

Charlotte Hall's Assisted Living Program is designed to meet the needs of veterans requiring minimal assistance with everyday activities, and is intended to help maintain their independence. In addition to their room and board, Assisted Living residents receive primary medical care, all Home physician prescribed medications, transportation to and from the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Washington, DC for those who wish to utilize the VA medical system, free local telephone service, subsidized cable TV service, and a separate activities program tailored to a more active lifestyle.

FROM THE CHAPLAIN

A very special day is soon to be celebrated - Memorial Day.

In addition to long-term and primary medical care, the Home makes available diagnostic and medical services such as psychiatric, dental, podiatry, laboratory and radiology services that are furnished to residents by outside providers. The Home has physicians on site daily, a staff psychologist, and also provides social and recreational activities to enhance the quality of life of the residents.

Specialized care for men and women suffering from Alzheimer's Disease and other related dementias is provided in the Home's secure unit. The Home's Alzheimer's support group meetings are open to the families of the home's dementia residents to help them understand and cope with the varied aspects of that disease.

The Home is Medicare/Medicaid certified, and all veteran residents receive a per diem subsidy from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs that is applied toward the cost of their care. Assisted Living veteran residents also receive a State of Maryland subsidy that covers much of the cost of their care, depending upon their income. While Charlotte Hall and all of its equipment are the property of the State, the Home is managed by Health Management Resources (HMR) under a contract with the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs, the governing agency of the Home. The Home's State Executive Director and his staff monitor the Contractor's performance to ensure contract compliance; to protect the State's investment in the facility; to ensure the facility and equipment are maintained; to act as liaison between the Contractor, State and federal agencies, veterans and other organizations; to provide resident advocacy; and to accept all donations on behalf of the State.

The Home is inspected Annually, and at other times as required by the Office of Health Care Quality, MD Dept. of Health & Mental Hygiene, and by the U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs.

Memorial Day is May 28th this year. It is a day when we pause to remember those who have gone on before and in particular our veterans, many who gave their lives in combat so that we might enjoy the freedom we have in this great land. This day might also be called Remembrance Day. Many people will visit cemeteries to place flags and flowers on graves and simply pause to remember. It is a day we especially think of those in our family who have left us. Our Post has numerous widows and widowers who have a void in their lives. At first this is unbearable grief, but with time it becomes fond memories. And on this special day we might visit the gravesite and simply remember. It isn't easy to deal with the loss of someone so close and so loved. There is a wonderful Psalm in the Bible that gives much comfort in this. It is Psalm 77 and the first 15 verses. Since it is too lengthy for this article, I encourage you to dust off your Bible and read it. Here are just a few lines:

“ In the day of my trouble I sought the Lord; I complained, and my spirit was overwhelmed... I am so troubled that I cannot speak... I call to remembrance my song in the night; I meditate within my heart... Will the Lord be favorable no more, has His mercy ceased forever?... Has God forgotten to be gracious?... But I will remember the years of the right hand of the Most High... surely I will remember Your wonders of old, I will meditate on Your work, and talk of Your deeds...” Many of our men and women today in Iraq and Afghanistan, in war, feel this loneliness, and many in the home front are experiencing grief that is overpowering. The Psalmist asks: has God forgotten to be gracious – where are his tender mercies? And he answers by remembering all God had done in the past, meditating on His great works and speaking of it to others. In Luke 12:6,7 Jesus speaks these words: “Are not five sparrows sold for two copper coins? And not one of them is forgotten before God. But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Do not fear therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows.”

Memorial Day – Remembrance Day.

Some years ago I visited a cemetery in Luxembourg. As far as the eye could see there was row after row of crosses and Stars of David, headstones for the many Americans of the 3rd Army who give their lives in World War II. At the head, by itself, was one single cross marking the grave of General Patton. Another cemetery at Metz, France had the graves of so many who gave their lives in World War I. So many graves were simply marked: A soldier of the Great War: KNOWN UNTO GOD.” Honoring the Royal Air Force, Winston Churchill made a famous statement: “ Never in the history of mankind have so many owed so much to so few.” And at Bastogne, Belgium a memorial plaque honoring the U.S. 101st Airborne Division reads: “Seldom has so much American blood been shed in the course of a single action, O LORD, HELP US TO REMEMBER.”

On this day of remembrance we will again gather around the flagpole in the Post parking lot for a brief ceremony of remembrance for the men and women of our armed forces who have gone on to Post Everlasting, and also those who even now are guarding the gates of freedom and those in harm’s way. Please join us and REMEMBER.
