Message from the Chaplain

My favorite time of the year is rapidly approaching and that is Autumn. The weather is just right, the leaves turn into blazing, beautiful colors, and the kids are back in school.

As I write this we have terrible warfare going on between Israel and the Hezbollah in Lebanon. Hopefully by the time you read this it will be over. Many people and some of our troops are getting hurt and killed in Iraq and Afghanistan. The Muslims take their religion much more seriously than Westerners do. It controls their politics and their entire culture. The Shiites have been waiting for more than a thousand years for the return of the 12th imam who will end all evil in the world and Islam will reign supreme. The Shiites differ from the Sunnis in this. They believe that leadership of Islam was given to Muhammad's son-in-law and then down through a series of descendents called imams. NEED SOME FLORIDA SUNSHINE?

The Severn River Lions Club, a service organization, sells select Florida citrus each month from November through April. All proceeds of the sales go to charities and school scholarships. The club offers premium fruit shipped directly from the orchards to Severna Park. Ruby Red grapefruit is offered each month. In December navel oranges and tangerines are also available. In January, Temple oranges are offered. Frequently navel oranges are also available in January. Grapefruit costs \$10 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$18 for a 4/5 bushel box. Navel oranges run \$11 for 2/5 bushel and \$20 for 4/5 bushel. Cost of tangerines and Temple oranges is not yet available.
