I want to thank everyone who donated the food, and those who were involved with preparing the Thanksgiving Day dinner, especially Roni, and the McDonald brothers. A total of 101 dinners were served. We were fortunate to have Matt, a wounded Iraqi veteran from Walter Reed Hospital at our dinner. I do not think anyone went away hungry.

The Legion Bull and Oyster Roast was a huge success, thanks to Jim Ford and all those who helped. Without the support of the volunteers, these type events would not produce the revenue that is required to keep the post operating. The Post has installed 10 new tall round tables in the lounge to increase the seating capacity. The cost of these tables was covered by the sales of 50/50 tickets sold by the Auxiliary, and the revenue produced when the canteen was operated for the Southwest flag football game in October. At the

present time the Post has received two bids to replace the hall A/C units; we are waiting for one more bid.

To try and keep track of the tables and chairs that we make available to Post members a \$50.00 deposit will be required, and refunded when the items are returned.

The establishment of the Sons of the American Legion as a non-political, non-sectarian civilian organization was authorized by action of the 14th national Convention of the American Legion in Portland Oregon on September 12-15th, 1932.

So, as you can see they have been around for many years. Here at Post 175 our SAL Squadron was voted on and approved at the Post 175 General Membership meeting held in August of 1971. The Charter membership of Squadron 175 immediately filed with American Legion National Headquarters Indianapolis, IN and was given their American Legion Charter on September 20, 1971. Finally they were given their charter by the state of Maryland on September 30, 1971.

As you can see they have been around for quite a while, through the years they have been a valuable asset and have contributed greatly to the success of the **American Legion and Post 175**. If you think they don't belong or we don't need them please think it through and I am sure you will change your mind before you speak or think ill of them again.

We Want Your Old Eyeglasses

Chances are that you have at least one pair of old unused eyeglasses on the shelf because you didn't want to just toss them. The **Severn River Lions Club** has an easy solution for you. The club collects old but useable eyeglasses and hearing aids for recycling. Twice each year all the Lions clubs in the district (Anne Arundel, Howard, Baltimore City and county, and Harford county) sort the glasses that have been collected. At the last sorting Lions boxed nearly

75,000 pairs of used eyeglasses. These are boxed and sent to an eyeglass reclamation facility in Virginia where they are sanitized, graded for prescription, marked and packaged for use in third world countries. The eyeglasses are given to needy vision impaired residents in these countries and help them see and be able to function with better vision.

The Lions also collect used hearing aids, which are refurbished and offered to needy people through the Towson University Speech and Hearing Center.

Where do I drop off my used eyeglasses or hearing aids? There is a colorful eyeglass collection box near the stage in the bar area of the Legion hall. On your next visit bring your used eyeglasses and drop them in the collection box.

The Lions thank you and a recipient somewhere in the world who receives your used eyeglasses to improve sight thanks you.

Severn River Lions Fruit Sale Benefit set for 2007- 2008

The Severn River Lions Club again is set to offer select Florida citrus each month from November through March.

The Lions offer premium fruit from H & S Citrus, shipped directly from the orchards to Severna Park.

Ruby Red grapefruit is offered every month. In November and December, navel oranges are in season. In January, navel oranges are typically in season. Otherwise, we offer tart, tangy and sweet temple oranges.

Grapefruit is \$16 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$28 for a 4/5 bushel box.

Navel oranges are \$15 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$26 for a 4/5 bushel box.

Honeybells (in January) are \$21 for a 2/5 bushel box.

All proceeds go to school scholarships and local charities.
