Well here it is spring already, and time to start thinking about election of officers. At the last membership meeting I asked for volunteers to be on the nominating committee. At our last General Meeting it was announced the Department Convention is coming up in July. Buddy George has been our coordinator of procuring accommodations and convention shirts for our members. He has a sign-up sheet posted on the bulletin board at the front entrance. If he is to do a good job at these two assignments he will need those who want shirts and those who will be attending the convention to sign up on these sheets by the April general meeting. If you snooze you may lose. You will be shirtless and sleeping on a park bench at convention time.

Good News after an extended period of time we were finally notified by Department the name change for the post is complete. HOORAY!!!

At the same meeting I asked for some volunteers to take on some of the duties I have assigned to Jim Corkery. I am pleased to tell you I did get one volunteer to take over the production of the Newsletter. She has participated in generating the current newsletter and will most likely assume the full responsibility with the June Newsletter.

There is still the need for additional volunteers to help with the morning activities. Jim has produced several Excel based processes to help simplify the process and at the same time give us a data collection system that will allow us to be aware of where our income that goes through the cash registers comes from on a daily basis. The balancing of the Pull tab machines has also been automated and I believe simplified to the extent it is relatively easy to teach someone how to do it. Anyone having some or desiring to get some experience on the computer, volunteering to help in this area will give you that opportunity. All you need do is let me know of your availability and the show up in the morning to help.

The Children's Easter Party was a huge success, and I would like to thank all the people who were responsible for putting it on. The Easter Bunny had a good time entertaining the children, but next year he said there will be a weight limit on who sits on his lap.

A contractor was selected and has installed the new A/C units for the hall. Bring on the hot days of summer we are ready. Not only from the viewpoint of being cool, but the new units are considerably more efficient than the old ones, so we are also saving money.

We have completed the switchover from AT&T and Millennium for our phone service and our internet service. We also elected to continue with Millennium as our TV service provider. This will realize an approximate savings of between \$800.00 and \$900.00 per year. The internet service is expected to be more reliable than before and also give us an improved level of service.

Those of you who join us for lunch in the lounge will notice a great improvement in the efficiency with

which our bartenders can accommodate your order nowadays. Thanks to the generosity of Pat Wachter, who donated \$1000.00 towards the purchase of our new food preparation station in memory of our Auxiliary Past President, Pat Kloes. Added to Pat's donation were donations from the Post organizations to make up the remainder of the cost of this station. The bartenders are extremely grateful for this improvement since it will save them many back aches at the end of their day.

The new machines in the poolroom area (LUCKY TAB II) seem to be going over very well with the membership. The state ruling on whether they are and will/will not remain legal however, are still up in the air. For now we will continue to offer this entertainment to the members. If later the ruling is negative we may need to remove them. Play them while we can.

I would like to suggest that we consider designating some of the proceeds from these machines toward procuring a POS system for our register and inventory control processes. This will probably be brought up to a vote at the next general meeting.

As you can see there is a lot of work required to keep the Post functioning on a daily basis. My thanks to those who have been doing their share of the work and those who have recently become members of that elite group known as "The Volunteers". It doesn't take much to join this group just see me and I will tell you exactly what you can do to join. One of our most dedicated volunteers is 80 YEARS OLD. Think you can keep up with him? Come on down. My sincere thanks go to this dedicated volunteer ---- Past Commander George Lucas.

We Want Your Old Eyeglasses

Chances are that you have at least one pair of old unused eyeglasses on the shelf because you didn't want to just toss them. The **Severn River Lions Club** has an easy solution for you. The club collects old but useable eyeglasses and hearing aids for recycling. Twice each year all the Lions Clubs in the district (Anne Arundel, Howard, Baltimore City and county, and Harford County) sort the glasses that have been collected. At the last sorting Lions boxed nearly 75,000 pairs of used eyeglasses. These are boxed and sent to an eyeglass reclamation facility in Virginia where they are sanitized, graded for prescription, marked and packaged for use in third world countries. The eyeglasses are given to needy vision impaired residents in these countries and help them see and be able to function with better vision.

The Lions also collect used hearing aids, which are refurbished and offered to needy people through the Towson University Speech and Hearing Center.

Where do I drop off my used eyeglasses or hearing aids? There is a colorful eyeglass collection box near the stage in the bar area of the Legion hall. On your next visit bring your used eyeglasses and drop them in the collection box.

The Lions thank you and a recipient somewhere in the world who receives your used eyeglasses to improve sight thanks you.

Severn River Lions Fruit Sale Benefit set for 2007 - 2008

The Severn River Lions Club again is set to offer select Florida citrus each month from November through March.

The Lions offer premium fruit from H & S Citrus, shipped directly from the orchards to Severna Park.

Ruby Red grapefruit is offered every month. In November and December, navel oranges are in season. In January, navel oranges are typically in season. Otherwise, we offer tart, tangy and sweet temple oranges.

Grapefruit is \$16 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$28 for a 4/5 bushel box.

Navel oranges are \$15 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$26 for a 4/5 bushel box.

Honey bells (in January) are \$21 for a 2/5 bushel box. All proceeds go to school scholarships and local charities.
